The pharmacist quickly took the mother to a quiet side reassured her about the condition and use of the medication and demonstrated the inhaler technique to the child. At the end of it all, the mother left the pharmacy completely reassured with a whole new understanding of the condition and was utterly grateful to the pharmacist for making her life a whole lot easier than she had imagined moments earlier. I was fascinated by how the pharmacist was able to transform patient care and having a direct effect on peoples' lives by using her professional knowledge and expertise. The pharmacist confirmed that she does not consider being a pharmacist as a job but rather a rewarding

vocation that offers a great satisfaction helping to solve patients' problems.
